## **Executive Summary**

#### Introduction & Background

The Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services (MHAS), in collaboration with the Mental Health and Addiction Services Board of Lucas County and the Butler County Mental Health and Addiction Recovery Services Board are recipients of a System of Care (SOC) Expansion and Sustainability Cooperative Agreement from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA). The federal grant is supporting the Engage 2.0 Project, cross-system efforts to improve behavioral health outcomes for children and youth in Northwest and Southwest Ohio experiencing serious emotional disturbances as well as other behavioral health challenges and their families. Participating counties in Southwest Ohio are Butler, Clermont, Clinton, Preble, and Warren Counties.


With support from SAMHSA, the Butler County Educational Service Center contracted to conduct a regional cradle to career and behavioral health fund mapping project for Fiscal Years 2015, 2017 and 2019. The project also includes a future update to incorporate FY 2021 actual data. To inform the SOC strategic financing plan, David McNear, a fiscal mapping consultant with McNear Fiscal Surveying, researched and prepared the fund maps in the Southwest Ohio participating counties, with much-needed consultation and consistent cooperation from the regional Engage 2.0 Executive Committee and regional SOC grant partners. The project includes a behavioral health fund map, or a regional review of public investments in children and adolescents under age 19 with behavioral health challenges, an early childhood fund map, or an inventory of regional investments in children under age 5, and a regional cradle to career fund map, or a fiscal survey of public spending on children, youth, and families.

#### Key Findings of the Behavioral Health Fund Mapping Process

Regional behavioral health investments increased nearly 10% throughout the survey period. FY 2015 behavioral health spending was \$89.9 million; investments grew by 2.8% in FY 2017 to \$92.5 million and increased 6.8% from FY 2017 to \$98.7 million in FY 2019, for a cumulative increase of 9.8% from FY 2015 to FY 2019. The growth in overall cradle to career spending slightly outpaced behavioral health spending growth. Driven by boosted Education and Health spending, regional cradle to career investments increased 11.8% from FY 2015 to FY 2015 to FY 2019, increasing from \$2.33 billion in fiscal 2015 to \$2.43 billion in FY 2017, or a 4.5% spending change, and to \$2.60 billion in FY 2019, or 7% growth from FY 2017. Behavioral health investments accounted for 3.9% of total cradle to career spending in FY 2015 and 3.8% of total spending in both FYs 2017 and 2019.



Since the regional population of children and youth decreased by 1.5% over the survey period, per child behavioral health spending grew faster than total behavioral health spending. In FY 2015, regional per child behavioral health spending was \$415 and increased to \$431 in FY 2017, or 3.7%, and grew to \$463 in FY 2019, a boost of 7.5% from FY 2017 and a cumulative jump of 11.5% from FY 2015.



In each year of the survey period, over 85% of behavioral health investments were either school-based services, e.g., school psychiatrists or special education behavioral health services, or home/community-based services, like counseling and therapy or substance abuse prevention. Spending on these home/community-based or school-based services increase by 11.6% from FY 2015 to FY 2019 and grew from 85.8% of total behavioral health fund map spending in FY 2015 to 87.2% of total spending in FY 2019. The slight drop in home/community-based spending throughout the survey period is driven by a steady decline in Medicaid home/community-based spending, including prescriptions and professional services and spending in Clinics and health centers, which drops from \$42.3 million in FY 2015 to \$40.5 million in FY 2017 and \$36.8 million in FY 2019.

School-based services accounted for 29.1% of total behavioral health investments in FY 2015, growing to 31.1% of total spending in FY 2017 and 38.6% of total investments in FY 2019. The relative proportion of spending on school-based services to total behavioral health investments increased by 32.5% over the survey period. Behavioral health institutional investments, e.g., psychiatric hospitalization or behavioral health services for juvenile youth, accounted for less than 15% of total behavioral health fund map spending, making up 14.2% of total spending in FY 2015 and going down to 12.8% in FY 2019. This deep-end institutional spending dropped by 1.4% over the same time frame, driven by a 7.7% decrease in spending on psychiatric hospitalization.



K-12 Education spending, including guidance counselors and school psychiatrists and special education behavioral health services, accounted for an increasing proportion of regional behavioral health spending,

growing from 29% in FY 2015 to 31% in FY 2017 and 39% in FY 2019. Behavioral health spending, including Medicaid charges and mental health and substance abuse prevention and treatment, accounted for 68% of FY 2015 fund map investments, dropping to 66% in FY 2017 and 58% in FY 2019. Fluctuations in Medicaid spending account for the declining proportion of fund map investments. Public safety investments, which are behavioral health services for detained juveniles, were 3% of regional behavioral health spending in each year of the fund map survey period.



Over the survey period, spending went up on both mental health prevention, an increase of 149.3%, and substance abuse prevention, a jump of 207.9%. At the same time, investments in mental health treatment increased by 21.6% and dropped by 42% for substance abuse treatment. Due to the format of the Medicaid data reporting, these prevention and treatment spending data do not include Medicaid behavioral health charges. Medicaid behavioral health spending in clinics and health centers grew by 7% from FY 2015 to FY 2019, while Medicaid spending on behavioral health counseling and professional services went up by 115.8% and Medicaid spending on behavioral health prescriptions/drugs fell by 36.5%. Spending on Psychiatric Hospitalization decreased by 7.7% from FY 2015 to FY 2019, dropping from \$9.3 million to \$9.6 million in FY 2017 and \$8.6 million in FY 2019.

Behavioral health investments passed through State Agencies, which are all passed through the Department of Medicaid except for \$62,433 in FY 2019 spending passed through the Department of Youth Services, go down throughout the survey period, dropping from 58% of total FY 2015 behavioral health spending to 55% in FY 2017 and 46% in FY 2019. The decline in Medicaid behavioral health spending was mostly driven by declines in spending on Prescriptions, which dropped from \$20.5 million in FY 2015 to \$17.8 million in FY 2017 and \$13 million in FY 2019.

Behavioral health spending passed through county agencies, including ESCs, and school districts went up over the survey period. Spending passed through county agencies increased from 21% of total behavioral health investments in FY 2015 to 22.6% in FY 2017 and 28.2% in FY 2019. With data in the fund map from 22 responding districts of the 39 regional districts, behavioral health spending passed through school districts grew from 21.3% of total investments in FY 2015 to 22.9% in FY 2017 and 25.6% in FY 2019.

# Ohio Department of Education: Student Wellness and Success Funding: Collaborate with School Districts to Inform Spending Plans & Innovative Uses of Funds

State legislation passed in 2019 – HB 166 – created the <u>Student Wellness and Success</u> program and invested \$675 million in funding to support student achievement by providing mental health counseling and therapy, after school and mentoring programs, wraparound services and other student and family supports. In October 2020, regional school districts received \$21.4 million in Student Wellness and Success funding.<sup>1</sup>

For an initiative to receive Student Wellness and Success Funding, the project or service must meet one of the eligibility criteria for funding and a plan for spending funds should be produced in partnership with one of the eligible community partner agencies.

Initiatives Eligible for Student Wellness and Success Funds

- 1. Mental health services
- 2. Services for homeless youth
- 3. Services for children involved with the child welfare system
- 4. Community liaisons
- 5. Physical health care services
- 6. Mentoring programs
- 7. Family engagement and support services
- 8. City Connects programming
- 9. Professional development related to providing trauma-informed care and regarding cultural competence.
- 10. Before or after school services or services provided any time school is not in session.

School districts must develop a plan for the use of funding in collaboration with one of the following community partners. <u>Further resources and eligible programs and services for each type of initiative</u> are available from DOE. #### Enhance and Expand Reimbursement through the Ohio Medicaid Schools Program

The <u>Ohio Schools Medicaid Program</u> (MSP), jointly administered by the Departments of Education and <u>Medicaid</u>, enables school districts and other contracted entities, including Educational Service Centers (ESCs), to secure Medicaid reimbursement for eligible services, specialized transportation and certain administrative activities provided to eligible children and youth. The eligible services are provided through an Individualized Education Plan (IEP).


Regional reimbursements through MSP declined throughout the fund map survey period and were \$383,935 in FY 2015, \$355,036 in FY 2017 and \$211,547 in FY 2019.<sup>2</sup> Butler County school districts claimed nearly 60% of MSP reimbursements in each year of the survey period, 59% in FY 2015 and FY 2017 and 57% in FY 2019. At the same time, the county's school districts represented 39% of regional K-12 Special Education spending, which is the eligible cost pool for MSP reimbursement.

Like special education spending, Butler County school districts do not have a relatively higher percent of Medicaid-eligible students in special education than other counties in the region. In FY 2019, school districts in both Clinton (59.1%) and Preble Counties (58%) had a higher percentage of Medicaid-eligible students with IEPs and Clermont County (51.7%) was just slightly lower than Butler County (53.5%). The percentage of Warren County Medicaid-eligible special education students was relatively lower than the rest of the region at 30%.<sup>3</sup>

#### Apply for FY 2022 Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services Funding Opportunities

While the application windows have closed for FY 2021 MHAS funding opportunities, available grants included State Opioid Response – Integrated Behavioral Health Care, Community Education and Outreach Initiative, Evaluation, Training, Data Collection and Reporting for the opioid response grant, and Specialized Docket Subsidy Projects. When available, notices of FY 2022 MHAS Funding Opportunities will be posted here.

#### **Pursue Federal Grants**

SAMHSA will award up to 17 Enhancement and Expansion of Treatment and Recovery Services for Adolescents, <u>Transitional Aged Youth and their Families grants</u> with total available funding of \$9.5 million, to expand and enhance treatment, early intervention and recovery services for adolescents and transitional aged youth experiencing SUD and/or COD and their families/caregivers. Eligible applicants include states and counties; and grants will be awarded up to a five-year period with up to \$545,000 in funding per year. The grant does not include any cost sharing or funding match requirement. The <u>application materials</u> include application and submission requirements and materials, evaluation criteria as well as information on key personnel, required and allowable activities. The application deadline is February 8, 2021.

SAMHSA is accepting applications through February 5, 2021 for <u>Mental Health Awareness Training Grants</u> (MHAT) to support the training of community partners to recognize signs of mental disorders, particularly those with SMI and/or SED, to create partnerships with school-and/or community-based agencies to refer individuals with these signs of mental illness to needed services, to train community partners in crisis de-escalation techniques, and to educate individuals about available community resources for individuals experiencing mental illness. SAMHSA expects to award up to 134 grants with the \$16.8 million in total available funding. Eligible applicants include counties; and the grant award period is up to five years with available funding up to \$125,000 per year. Application materials and evaluation criteria are available in the <u>MHAT Funding Opportunity</u> <u>Announcement</u>

With an open application window until February 5, 2021, SAMHSA will award up to 24 grants of \$102,000 per year for three years to institutions of higher education, with total available funding of \$2.5 million, through the <u>GLS Campus Suicide Prevention Grant</u>. Providing an opportunity to strengthen collaboration with higher education partners, the grant will support the development of a cross-system plan to enhance mental health services for college students, to prevent mental health and substance use disorders, to promote help-seeking behavior and reduce negative associations, and to improve identification and treatment of at-risk college

students. The <u>Funding Opportunity Announcement</u> provides further guidance on application materials and evaluation criteria.

SAMHSA is also accepting applications through February 5,2021 for a new round of <u>SOC Expansion and</u> <u>Sustainability grants</u>. Prior SOC grantees are not eligible to apply, though additional counties in the region who have not received SOC grants could apply in this current round. SAMHSA is accepting applications through January 4, 2021 for funding through the <u>Statewide Family Network</u> (SFN) and the <u>Statewide Consumer Network</u> <u>Program</u> (SCN). SFN grants support more effectively addressing the needs of children, youth, and young adults with SED; and Eligible applicants are limited to family-controlled organizations. Grants through the SCN program support efforts to address needs of adults with SMI and their families.

SAMHSA Grant Opportunity Forecasts are currently available for <u>Project AWARE (Advancing Wellness and</u> <u>Resiliency in Education) State Education Agency Grants</u>, the <u>Medication Assisted Treatment - Prescription Drug</u> <u>and Opioid Addiction</u>, the <u>Rural Emergency Medical Services Training Grant</u>, the <u>State Pilot Grant Program for</u> <u>Treatment for Pregnant and Postpartum Women</u>, and <u>Building Communities of Recovery</u>.

The Administration for Children and Families of the Department of Health and Human Services (ACYF) forecasts a grant opportunity for funding through the <u>Family Support through Primary Prevention (FSPP) Demonstration</u> <u>Sites</u>. ACYF anticipates awarding up to \$4.5 million through 6 grants between \$500,00 and \$750,000 with an application due date of May 13, 2021 for eligible applicants, which include county governments. Like SOC grants, FSPP grants will fund five-year intensive projects to demonstrate cross-system approaches to engage communities in improving child and family well-being.

ACYF anticipated awarding grants to eligible applicants, including county governments, of between \$550,000 and \$900,000 to support projects to implement and evaluate adolescent pregnancy prevention initiatives through the <u>Personal Responsibility Education Program Innovative Strategies</u>. County governments are also eligible to apply for ACYF grants through the <u>Personal Responsibility Education Program</u> to support efforts to educate youth on prevention of pregnancy, sexually transmitted infections and HIV/AIDS, through the <u>Sexual Risk Avoidance Education Program</u>, through the <u>Title V Competitive Sexual Risk Avoidance Education grants</u>, and via the <u>Street Outreach Program</u>, providing street-based services to homeless or runaway youth as well as the <u>Basic Center Program grants</u>, providing emergency shelter and counseling to homeless youth or youth who otherwise might end up involved with child welfare, mental health or juvenile justice systems.

HHS's Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) will award up to 20 grants of up to \$255,600 for the <u>Early Childhood Comprehensive Systems: Health Integration Prenatal-to-Three Program</u> to implement integrated maternal and early childhood systems of care. Eligible applicants include any domestic public or private entity; and the application deadline is March 15, 2021.

The Department of Labor's Employment and Training Administration (ETA) will award up to 75 <u>YouthBuild</u> grants, with an application deadline of February 2, 2021, to support education, job skills training and employment services to at-risk youth ages 16 to 24. ETA estimates total available funding to be \$89,000,000, with an individual grant range of \$700,000 to \$1,500,000. Eligible applicants are public or private non-profit agencies.

The Office of Juvenile Justice Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP) in the Department of Justice will award 15 grants to eligible applicants, including county governments, through the <u>FY21 Juvenile Drug Treatment Court Program</u>, with up to \$10.5 million in available funding. The application deadline is February 5, 2021.

County governments are also eligible to apply for OJJDP grants through the FY 2021 <u>Second Change Act Youth</u> <u>Offender Reentry Program</u> to support juvenile youth returning to their community. OJJDP will award up to 13 grants with \$9.75 million in available funding. The application deadline is February 5, 2021.

The Department of Justice's Office on Violence Against Women will make up to 23 awards of between \$550,000 and \$650,000 to support <u>the Justice for Families Program</u> to improve response of civil and criminal justice systems to families with a history of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking or child sexual abuse. Eligible applicants include county governments; and the application deadline is January 22, 2021.

Regional philanthropic institutions or foundations with an historical tie to the region are also potential sources of grant funding to support behavioral health or support services. Foundations with a track record of supporting programs for children and youth in the region include <u>The James M. Cox Foundation</u>, <u>The Dayton Foundation</u>, <u>Greater Cincinnati Foundation</u>, <u>Carol Ann and Ralph V. Haile, Jr./U.S. Bank Foundation</u>, <u>Hamilton Community Foundation</u> and the <u>Mathile Family Foundation</u>, which has a priority focus of supporting opportunities for children in the Greater Dayton region.

Build on Existing System of Care and School-Based & Home/Community-Based Mental Health Financing Resources & Best Practices

California's <u>Children and Youth System of Care</u> serves foster children and youth who have experienced serious trauma. A <u>July 2020 webinar offered technical assistance on fiscal resource management</u>, including best practices and local case studies with potential funding sources. The <u>State of Texas' System of Care Toolkit</u> provides 11 training modules, including a <u>strategic planning course</u>.

The <u>Pennsylvania System of Care Partnership</u> released an August 2020 <u>System of Care: A Comprehensive Toolkit</u> <u>for County Implementation</u> which offers sections on strategic planning and funding as well as sample templates and other implementation resources. The <u>July 2018 update of the Nevada System of Care Implementation –</u> <u>Strategic Plan</u> includes Funding Structures goal update (page 36) to maximize SOC funding.

<u>Connecticut's Children's Behavioral Health Plan</u> includes a financing section (page 15). The Georgetown University Center for Child and Human Development produced a <u>Toolkit for Expanding the System of Care</u> <u>Approach</u>, which included a <u>Guide to Developing a System of Care Financing Plan</u>.

The <u>Mental Health Technology Transfer Center Network</u> published a July 2020 webinar <u>Financing School-Based</u> <u>Mental Health Services during a State Budget Crisis</u>. The <u>Center for School Mental Health</u> of the University of Maryland's School of Medicine released a January 2020 <u>School Mental Health Quality Guide: Funding &</u> <u>Sustainability</u> including background, best practices, case studies and financing resources.

The Center for Health and Health Care in Schools' report <u>Developing a Business Plan for Sustaining School</u> <u>Mental Health Services</u> highlights success stories in three jurisdictions: Family Services Association of Bucks County, Pennsylvania, The Washburn Center for Children in Hennepin County, Minnesota and District of Columbia's School Mental Health Program



#### Key Findings from the Cradle to Career Fund Mapping Process


Over the fund map survey period, regional cradle to career investments rose by \$275.4 million, or 11.8%, from \$2.32 billion in FY 2015 to \$2.60 billion in FY 2019.

Regional cradle to career spending per child went up from \$10,749 in FY 2015 to \$11,328 in FY 2017, an increase of 5.4%, then grew 7.7% to \$12,204 in FY 2019, a cumulative increase of 13.5%.



Over the fund map survey period, per child spending growth (13.5%) outpaced the growth in regional counties' revenue growth (13.1%), state revenue growth (6.6%), and inflation in the Midwest region (5.0%). <sup>4</sup>



Education spending accounted for more than 70% of cradle to career investments in each year, growing from 70.0% in FY 2015 to 70.7% in FY 2017 and 71.5% in FY 2019. Spending on Health programs and services went up from 12% of total FY 2015 investments to 12.5% in FY 2017 and 12.4% in FY 2019. Human Services spending dropped from 14.9% of total FY 2015 cradle to career investments to 13.6% in FY 2017 to 12.9% in FY 2019. Spending on Public Safety was steady at 3.1% of total investments in FYs 2015 and 2017 and 3.2% in FY 2019.



Regional investments in K-12 education accounts for the bulk of education spending and grew from \$1.59 billion in FY 2015 to \$1.86 billion<sup>5</sup>, while spending on early education and child care, including Head Start, preschool, and early childhood special education, was up from \$28.1 million in FY 2015 to \$37.6 million in FY 2019. Youth Development spending is investments in Parks and Recreation and Libraries and is allocated to fund map with percent of County population under age 18. Medicaid charges make up most spending in both Behavioral Health and Physical/Somatic Health and were up from \$228.5 million in FY 2015 to \$245.5 million in FY 2017 and \$256.7 million in FY 2019. Human Services spending includes child care assistance, Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits, Supplemental Security Income (SSI) and Old-Age, Survivors and Disability Insurance (OASDI) benefits, and Ohio Works First (OWF) cash assistance. Criminal Justice investments are spending on Police/Sheriff allocated with percent of county population under age 18.


## Key Findings from the Early Childhood Fund Mapping Process

Over the fund map survey period, regional early childhood investments grew 24.3%, going up from \$146.0 million in FY 2015 to \$156.4 million in FY 2017, an increase of 7.1%, to \$181.4 million in FY 2019, a 16% increase. ODM staff provided regional Medicaid charges by age and Medicaid charges for children under age 5 are included in the early childhood fund map. The average cost per case of providing care to babies born prematurely or with other special health needs, including Neonatal Intensive Care Unit stays and ongoing care, is extremely high. Based on health care needs of infants and young children in the region, the need for this intensive care fluctuates across the counties in the region and through the years of the fund map survey period. For example, Medicaid charges for children under 5 for facilities spending, including NICU and other hospital care, jumped \$11 million in Butler County from FY 2017 to FY 2019.

Factoring out Medicaid charges can help to account for this fluctuation and to report on trends in early childhood investments, like maternal and child health and early education and child care. Excluding Medicaid charges, regional early childhood investments grew 22.8% over the survey period, going up from \$69.5 million in FY 2015 to \$77.3 million in FY 2017, a 11.3% increase, and to \$85.3 million in FY 2019, a 10.3% increase.

Regional early childhood spending per child under age 5 was also up through the survey period, increasing by 25.9% with Medicaid charges and by 24.4% excluding Medicaid charges.



Early education and child care investments reported under Education include spending on Early Head Start/Head Start, preschool, and early childhood special education, while that spending reported under Human Services is spending on child care assistance. Developmental Disabilities investments are DD early intervention services spending, while Maternal and Child Health spending includes investments in Women, Infants and Children (WIC) program and Help Me Grow home visiting and early intervention. Physical/Somatic Health spending is Medicaid charges for children under age 5.



## Engage 2.0 Southwest Ohio Region: Behavioral Health Fund Map

Regional behavioral health investments grow from \$89.9 million in FY 2015 to \$92.5 million in FY 2017 and \$98.7 million in FY 2019.



As spending increased, the regional population of children under age 18 remained relatively steady, declining 1.5% over the survey period. Regional behavioral health spending per child went up 11.5% over the survey period, increasing from \$415 in FY 2015 to \$431 in FY 2017 to \$463 in FY 2019.

Variabilities in Medicaid charges and spending on school-based behavioral health services partially account for trends in county spending through the survey period. K-12 behavioral health spending is 38.6% of FY 2019 fund map investments. The fund map includes behavioral health spending in 22 of 39 regional school districts that either had available data online or responded to a fund mapping information request. Variations in districts with data currently included in the fund map across counties partly accounts for the variations among county spending. Medicaid charges are 36.4% of FY 2019 behavioral health investments. Eligibility for Medicaid is based on income; and differences in the relative wealth of counties in the region also partly accounts for differences in spending across counties.




The \$7.5 million decrease in Medicaid: Prescriptions/Drugs spending over the fund map survey period is driven by decreases of \$3.6 million in Butler County, \$1.7 million in Clermont County and \$1.2 million in Warren County. The \$5 million increase in K-12 Student Services: Behavioral Health between FY 2015 and FY 2019 is partially accounted for by a \$2.2 million increase in Clermont County and a \$1 million increase in Warren County. The \$7 million increase in K-12 Special Education: Behavioral Health spending between FY 2017 and FY 2019 is mostly driven by a \$5.5 million increase in Warren County.


Federally funded behavioral health spending goes down by 1.3% over the survey period, while state funding drops 3.1% and locally funded spending increases by 43.1%. Medicaid charges were down by \$5 million, or 12%, from FY 2015 to FY 2019 and are funded with federal and state funds. In FY 2019, the federal Medicaid match for Ohio was 63% with the state providing 37% matching funds. As Medicaid spending dropped, the matching state and federal funds also went down. K-12 spending, which is mostly funded through local sources, on behavioral health increased by \$11.9 million over the survey period.



ODM staff reported regional Medicaid behavioral health charges for children under age 18 by county, gender, race, service type, and primary diagnosis. Regional charges were \$52.0 million in FY 2015, \$50.4 million in FY 2017 and \$45.6 million in FY 2019, a 12.4% decrease over the survey period. FY 2015 Behavioral Health Medicaid charges were 18.5% of total Medicaid spending, dropping to 17% in FY 2017 and 15.1% in FY 2019.



Medicaid charges in each county were relatively stable throughout the survey period. The decrease in Butler County is mainly driven by a \$3.6 million drop in spending on prescribed drugs; and a \$1.2 million drop in Warren County spending for prescribed drugs also accounts for most of the county's change in Medicaid behavioral health charges.



Spending on K-12 education is about 70% of total cradle to career spending, so variabilities in student enrollment over time and across counties partly accounts for trends in county spending and differences in spending across counties. Entitlement spending on Medicaid, SNAP, WIC, OWF and child care assistance accounted for more than 15% of total cradle to career spending: 17.1% in FY 2015, 16.1% in FY 2017 and 15.2% in FY 2019. Eligibility for these entitlements is based on household income, so variations in wealth among counties in the region accounts for some of the differences in spending across counties.






The increase in spending from FY 2015 to FY 2019 is partly driven by an \$11.2 million increase in spending in Warren County. Slightly less than half, or 46%, of the increase in Warren County early childhood spending between FY 2015 and FY 2019 is due to a \$5.1 million increase in Medicaid reimbursements, including \$3.7 million more in facilities spending and \$1.7 million more in spending on professional services. County spending on early education and child care was up \$5.6 million between FY 2015 and FY 2019, including a \$2.8 million increase in spending on Early Head Start and Head Start, a \$1.1 million increase in child care assistance, an increase of \$968,172 for preschool spending in early childhood education, and a \$648,368 increase in early childhood special education. The large increase in spending between FY 2017 and FY 2019 is partly driven by a \$14 million jump in Medicaid charges from FY 2017 in Butler County, with an \$11.1 million increase in spending in facilities.



Federally funded early childhood spending went up 26.5% over the survey period, while locally funded spending increased by 25.7% and state funded investments grew by 19.0%.



Over the fund map survey period, the regional spending growth in early education and child care of 28.3% outpaced the rate of improvement in school district Kindergarten Readiness Assessment scores, which improved on average by 3.4%.<sup>7</sup> There were wide variations in improvement in KRA score improvement among counties, which, along with the lack of data on the number of students tested per district, affected the calculation of the regional rate of improvement.





Butler County early childhood investments went up slightly in FY 2017, increasing 0.3% from \$75.3 million in FY 2015 to \$75.5 million, and jumped 23.7% in FY 2019 to \$93.1 million, a 23.7% cumulative increase from FY 2015.



The cumulative growth in early childhood spending, excluding Medicaid charges, was 18.4%, increasing from \$33.5 million in FY 2015 to \$36.1 million in FY 2017 and \$39.7 million in FY 2019. Total early childhood investments were 7.4% of county cradle to career spending in FY 2015, 7.1% in FY 2017 and 8.1% in FY 2019. 




